## Open Waterfall Viewing

- ◆ **Bridal Veil Falls** – I-84, Bridal Veil Falls Viewpoint
  - ◆ **Dog Creek Falls Observation Site** – WA State Highway 14
  - ◆ **Dry Creek Falls** – Pacific Crest Trail, Cascade Locks, OR
  - ◆ **Herman Creek Trail** – Mount Hood National Forest
  - ◆ **Hamilton Mountain Loop Trail** – Washington State Highway 14
  - ◆ Beacon Rock State Park
  - ◆ **Latourell Falls Loop** – I-84, Guy Talbot State Park
  - ◆ **Multnomah Falls** – I-84, Columbia River Gorge Scenic Area
  - ◆ **Mosier Creek Falls** – I-84, Mosier OR, Pocket Park
  - ◆ **Panther Creek Falls** – Gifford Pinchot National Forest
  - ◆ **Lower Falls Recreation Site** – Gifford Pinchot National Forest
  - ◆ **Starvation Creek Falls** – I-84, Starvation Creek State Park
- Other waterfalls include; Cabin Creek Falls, Lancaster Falls and Hole in the Wall Falls

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## Bicycling Opportunities

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Please respect trail and area closure signs and follow land ownerships rules, regulations and guidelines. Check the land managers' website for the latest information on road and trail openings and closures.

### Road Cycling

- ◆ **Historic Columbia River Highway State Trail** – Closed between Angels Rest and Ainsworth State Park. Open at Twin Tunnels, Starvation Creek State Park and Viento State Park.
- ◆ Hood River to Mosier - 14 miles, round trip.
- ◆ Mosier to The Dalles Loop - 28.3 miles, round trip.

### Mountain Biking

- ◆ **Larch Mountain Trail #244** and area trails are closed due to fire damage.
- ◆ **Gorge 400 Trail** – Only open between Cascade Locks and Wyeth (MP 25 - 35)
- ◆ **Coyote Wall** – A network of trails off of Washington State Highway 14, Columbia River Gorge National Scenic Area
- ◆ **Klickitat Trail** – Washington State Highway 14, Columbia River Gorge Scenic Area
